St. HOPE Public Schools Public Comment Policy

At a regular meeting, any person may address the Council concerning any item on the agenda and any other matters under the Council's jurisdiction. At a special meeting, any person may address the Council only concerning any item on the agenda. The total time devoted to presentations to the Council on all public comment (including agenda items and non-agenda items at regular meetings) shall not exceed one-half hour, unless additional time is granted by the Council. Normally, individuals may be granted 2 minutes each for public comment. The Chairperson may curtail individual presentations if repetitive of points raised by others, particularly if it appears the total allotted time may be exceeded.

In accordance with the requirements of the Americans With Disabilities Act and related federal regulations, individuals who require special accommodations, including but not limited to an American Sign Language Interpreter, accessible seating or documentation in accessible format, should contact the Superintendent's office at least two days before the meeting.

All public comment concerning all matters shall be heard immediately after the meeting is called to order and prior to the formal discussion of the agenda topics by the Council and consideration of action.

Citizens desiring Council action on an item are encouraged to seek placement of the issue on the Council agenda in accordance with policy rather than presenting the matter during public comment. This will facilitate discussion and expedite resolution.
